Founded in 2011, this organization's primary function is to walk boldly in the transforming power of Jesus Christ as we aspire to develop our community.

General Position Summary:

Summer Camp Interns play a key role in planning and leading camps for kids during the summer months. With a strong emphasis on spiritual growth and relationship with Jesus Christ, Bridge of Grace partners with the Fort Wayne Police Department and the Fort Wayne Fire Department to provide enriching experiences developed to keep kids off the streets during the summer, to strengthen the relationship between the campers, law enforcement, and fire department, and also to educate campers on these professions. Summer Camp Interns have the responsibility to uphold the highest of standards and relate to campers, parents, church members and staff with the utmost respect and reverence as a Christian in accordance with Colossians 4:6, which says, "Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt..." This position requires high energy and the ability to make quick and sensitive decisions while attending to the individual needs of each child during a fast-paced camp.

Summer Camp Intern Job Description



Essential Functions/Major Responsibilities:

- Assist with check-in and check-out of each camper at the beginning and end of each camp day. This may include interacting with families and campers, and/or completing and filing paperwork.
- Assist and work closely with Camp Director
- Record and/or take pictures of campers and staff interactions, and camp activities and events
- Be involved with and monitor meals and meal temperatures
- Keep a close eye on all campers to ensure a fun and safe environment
- Assist in running camp activities
- Responsible for setting up and cleaning up all activities
- Attend required meetings and trainings
- Contribute to brainstorming sessions in an effort to plan and create fun and enriching activities
- Participate in all camp activities while providing leadership and sharing enthusiasm
- Work with Unit Heads, Program Directors, and other staff to meet the needs of the campers
- Encourage respect for personal property, camp equipment and facilities, as well as equipment and facilities while on field trips
- Commit to and uphold all camp rules
- Set a good example for the campers
- Observe camper's behavior, assess its appropriateness and apply any necessary strategic discipline
- Enforce appropriate safety regulations and emergency procedures
- Be present and on time for each activity period on and off site
- Provide leadership while instructing, guiding, and motivating campers during each activity
- Establish individual respect and relationships with each assigned camper
- Identify and meet the needs of campers
- Know the whereabouts of assigned campers at all times
- Actively participate and supervise campers at activities
- Work to develop a group/team feeling/spirit within the camp as a whole
